Subject: FEMA Notice of Changes in Flood Hazard Determinations

In the September 11, 2018, issue of the *Federal Register* (83 FR 45950, [click here](#)), the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) published the above notice of changes in flood hazard determinations. The notice lists communities where the addition or modification of Base Flood Elevations (BFEs), base flood depths, Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) boundaries or zone designations, or the regulatory floodway (hereinafter referred to as flood hazard determinations), as shown on the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) and, where applicable, in the supporting Flood Insurance Study (FIS) reports, is appropriate because of new scientific or technical data. The FIRM and, where applicable, the FIS report for each community have been revised to reflect these flood hazard determinations through issuance of a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR).

The affected communities are listed in the table published with the notice in the above cited *Federal Register*. To view the table, click on the above hyperlink in the first paragraph of this memorandum and go to pages 49551 through 49554 of the *Federal Register*. The specific flood hazard determinations are not described for each community in the notice; however, the revised flood hazard determination information for each community is available for inspection at both the online location and the respective community map repository address listed in the table. Additionally, the current effective FIRM and FIS report for each community are accessible online through the FEMA Map Service Center at <https://msc.fema.gov> for comparison.

These flood hazard determinations will be finalized on the dates listed in the table and revise the FIRM panels and FIS report in effect prior to this determination for the listed communities. However, from the date of the second publication of notification of these changes in a newspaper of local circulation, any person has 90 days in which to request that the Deputy Associate Administrator for Insurance and Mitigation reconsider the changes. The flood hazard determination information may be changed during the 90-day period.

For those who wish to submit comments on or to request reconsideration of the flood hazard determinations must submit them to the Chief Executive Officer of the applicable community as listed in the table.

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
